- Undertake planning, provisioning and management of all aspects of ground training and non-flying development programs provided at the Academy in assistance of the Ground Training Manager, or directly in his absence.
- Other Duties as reasonably requested by the Chief Ground Instructor or Chief Flying Instructor.

Essential Selection Criteria:

- Project management skills with a demonstrated ability to deliver programs and projects on time under minimal supervision
- Proven ability to research, build, implement and write aviation training packages
- Previous experience using a LMS
- A strong knowledge of adult learning principals
- In-depth knowledge of aviation, preferably holding an ATPL (CPL minimum)
- In-depth knowledge of pilot training, preferably holding a Flight Instructor Rating
- Have a Certificate IV in Training and Assessment
- Intermediate user of Microsoft Excel and Word
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Professional behaviour and presentation
